



Additional Options for Recycling Computer Equipment

If you have a piece of used computer equipment manufactured by a company that is not on TCEQ's list of manufacturers, or if you have other electronics equipment you wish to return for recycling, some of the companies listed below may have options for you. These companies list extended recycling and take-back options on their Web pages.

<i>Company</i>	<i>Description of additional services</i>
Apple	Free mail-back for Apple iPods and any brand of cell phones; mail-back of computers and monitors made by other manufacturers with purchase of new Apple computer or monitor, shipping charges apply
Bass Computers	Will take back any brand of computer equipment, including peripherals. Contact company about collection options.
Best Buy	Will take all brands of used electronics equipment and provide a Best Buy gift card for the recovered value; won't accept CRT monitors unless built-in to a system
Dell	Free pickup of any used Dell-branded products; free trade-in of other branded computer equipment with purchase of new Dell computer equipment, partnership with Goodwill to recycle all brands of used computer equipment
Gateway	Trade-in program to get cash for used electronics, including computers, monitors, cell phones, camcorders, digital cameras, multimedia projectors, home audio receivers, car audio, game system, PDAs, handheld PCs, iPods, and other electronic devices
HP	HP Inkjet or Laserjet cartridges and batteries
Prime Systems	Servers and most peripherals, other brands
LG	LG, Zenith, Goldstar TVs, monitors, audio equipment, video cassette players and recorders, DVD players and recorders, TV/VCR and TV/DVD units, set top boxes and accessories; Cell phones, GPS devices, PDAs of any brand
Sony	All Sony electronics, trade-in for credit when purchasing new laptop or camcorder

In addition to these programs, consumers can return used computer equipment made by any manufacturer through the [Dell-Goodwill Reconnect](#) program.

You can also check [Recycle Texas Online](#) or [1-800-CLEANUP](#) to find recyclers that accept used computer equipment and other electronics equipment.

NOTE: These companies are not required by Texas law to provide services in addition to computer equipment collection and recycling. The TCEQ has no independent means to verify the management practices these companies employ for any products not covered in Texas' Computer Equipment Recycling Program. When contracting with a recycler, please consider the factors in EPA's [Checklist for the Selection of Electronic Recycling Services](#).
